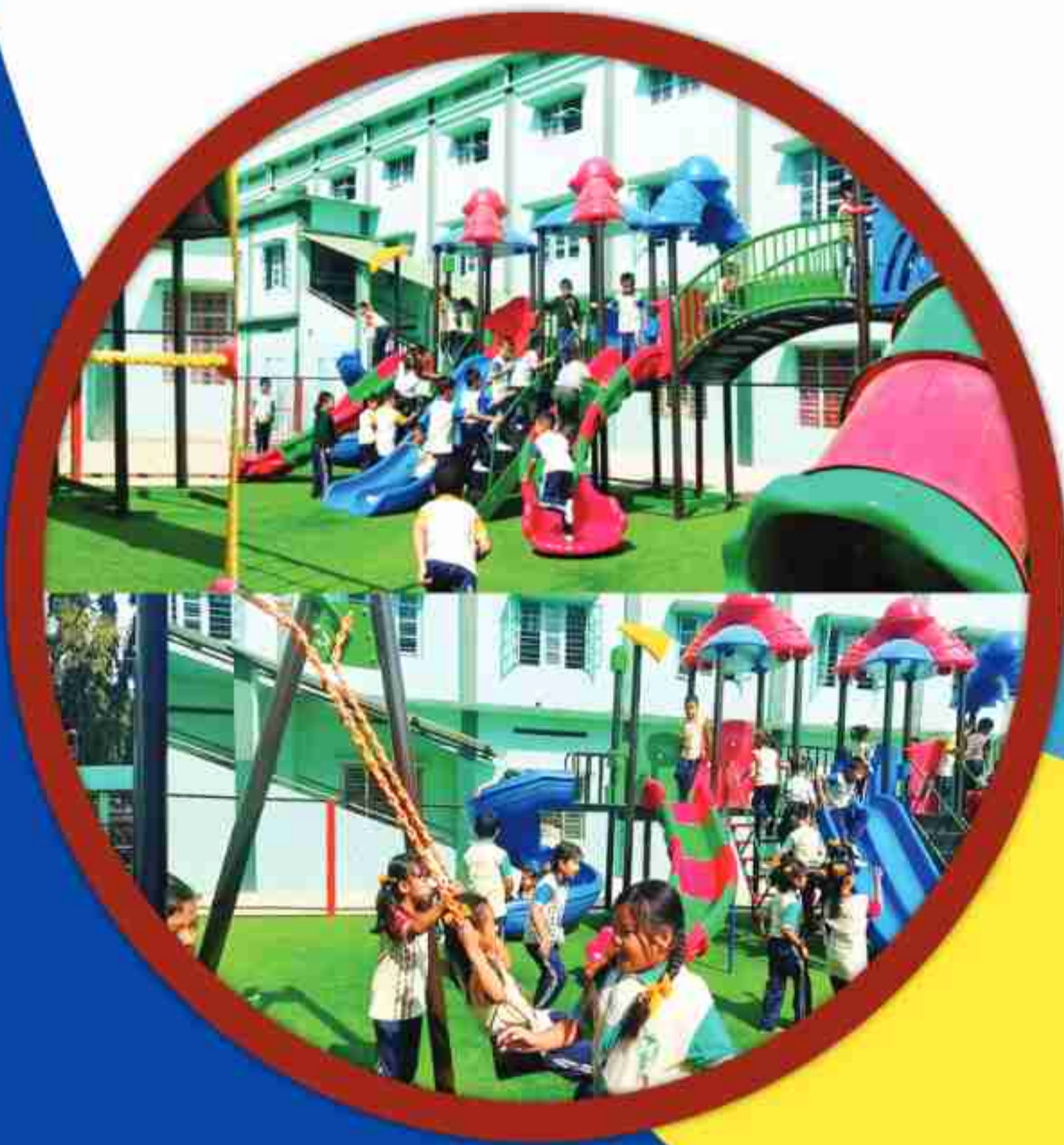

OUR INSPIRATION:

Our inspiration comes from the life and teachings of Saint Louis-Marie Grignon de Montfort, born on 31 January 1673. Even as young student he championed the cause of the poor. He helped them to live with dignity as children of God. Worn out by hard work and sickness, his end finally came on 28th April 1716. He was 43 years old.

FOUNDER OF RELIGIOUS CONGREGATIONS:

Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel (Montfort Brothers), The Company of Mary (Montfort Fathers), and the Daughters of Wisdom (Montfort Sisters). Spread across the five continents, these congregations continue in his footsteps to bring good news to the people. Montfort is known for his particular devotion to the Blessed Virgin Mary and the practice of consistently praying the Rosary. He is considered as one of the early proponents of Mariology. Mary to him is the surest and shortest way to Jesus.

MONTFORT BROTHERS OF ST. GABRIEL:

Montfort Brothers of St. Gabriel, is a religious society founded by St. Louis Marie De Montfort in France in the year 1715. Since then, we, the members of the society are engaged in the mission of education and social empowerment initiatives in over 35 countries. We proudly share the common philosophy and teaching methods of the Catholic Church in general, while drawing on our rich educational experiences and traditions, inherited as a society over the last three hundred years.

In India, we have our presence in almost all the States. We actively participate in diverse fields of apostolate that include formal and non-formal technical and academic education; education, care and rehabilitation of the physically and mentally challenged persons, the street children, and the orphans, the care of elderly people, empowerment of women and the marginalized and programmes aimed at the downtrodden in rural and urban areas. Holistic approach to education is our forte as we firmly believe that a young person learns from his / her whole school experiences.



MONTFORTIAN VISION OF EDUCATION:

Inspired by the founding spirit and charism of St. Montfort, and in the light of the common vision of Catholic Education of the Church, we, the Montfort Brothers adopt a holistic approach to education. Firmly believing that a young person learns his / her lessons from the whole school setting, we provide a rich variety of activities, courses and programmes. We strive to mould integral persons who are physically fit, intellectually competent, emotionally mature and morally sound, with a sense of the Divine and committed to the cause of justice, peace and brotherhood / sisterhood, and is characterised by respect for every human person.

Thus, Montfort School is a learning community animated by the Divine Sprit of Love and Freedom. God is the true light who dispels the darkness of ignorance from the hearts and minds of people. It is therefore fitting that the motto of the school is "LEAD KINDLY LIGHT". The letters DS in the school emblem is an abbreviation of the French words "DIEU SEUL", meaning "GOD ALONE" - the motto of St. Montfort.

COURSE OF STUDY:

The School prepares students for the All India Secondary School Examination (AISSE) and the All India Senior School Certificate Examination (AISSCE), conducted by the Central Board of Secondary Education (CBSE) Delhi. At the Senior School level, both Arts & Science streams are offered for the benefit of the students.

Subjects at the Secondary Level:

English, Science, Social Studies, Mathematics, IT, Hindi/Bengali

Subjects at the Higher Secondary Level:

English (Language -for both the streams)

Science Stream:

Physics, Chemistry, Biology, Typography, Maths/Physical Education

Arts Stream:

History, Geography, Sociology, Political Science, Typography/ Kokborok/ Physical Education

1. Private Tutions:

- a. The teaching regimen in the school makes 'private tutions' unnecessary. The tendency among the students and parents to engage private tutors from among our own school staff or others is against the prevailing rules of our school.
- b. In the case of slow learners and those students who may have particular difficulty in any subject may approach the Principal for remedial measures. If such remedial measures require help from the teachers, it is always done through remedial teaching by the teachers in the school with the written permission of the Principal and not through the tutions.

SPIRITUAL, MORAL, SOCIAL AND CULTURAL ETHOS AND VALUES:

Every day classes begin and end with prayers. School Assemblies are held every day throughout the school year. These assemblies contribute to the nurturing of the school ethos, providing opportunity to come together as a school. They allow pupils to be involved in activities and experiences that stimulate, challenge and extend their capacities for spiritual response to events, situations and to what happen to the community/society in which they live.



The spiritual, moral, social and cultural ethos promoted in the school enables children to be open and develop a positive self-image. Children are encouraged to have a loving and caring attitude towards others and be tolerant of, and respect different beliefs, customs and cultures. They are guided to form values such as respect, fairness, forgiveness and collaboration, etc

CLASSROOM DECORUM:

- i. Students must ensure that the desks and other furniture in the school is not damaged or disfigured and are not displaced.
- ii. Students shall ensure that all windows are closed, lights and fans switched off when leaving class for laboratory/library/outdoor activities or at the end of the day.
- iii. Sitting on the desks, playing in the classroom during breaks, shouting and whistling etc. should be strictly avoided.
- iv. Students shall not write or paste anything on the walls, black/white boards in the school.
- v. Students shall maintain the cleanliness of the classroom and the school campus by not throwing litter around.

- vi. Class Prefects have the responsibility of maintaining discipline in the class in the absence of teachers and the students are expected to obey and cooperate with them.

ASSESSMENT AND EXAMINATIONS:

Your child's work, behaviour and overall progress is assessed continuously in the school. This is done informally by the concerned teachers who deal with your child. Academic progress that your child is making is assessed by means of 'slip tests' or 'class tests' and the two term exams. Progress Report is prepared for the sake of the parents to keep track of the progress their child.

PROMOTION:

Promotion is granted on the basis of the whole year's performance of the student. Passing in the final examination alone will not be a guarantee for promotion to the next higher class. Result declared at the end of the year is final and will not be reconsidered under any circumstances. Answer scripts of the final examination will not be shown to the parents.

GENERAL RULES:

(A few rules are given in the prospectus and the rest are in the school handbook)

UNIFORM:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday Friday: Class I- X

Students' uniform consists of Green Chequered Shirts and Bottle Green Pants for boys and skirt up to knee length for girls, black 'Naughty Boy'/ 'Cindrella', shoes with bottle green socks/stockings, neck tie, badge, belt and bottle green sweater.

Wednesday:

Boys: Pants with traditional shirt and school shoes with socks.

Girls: Skirt / Rignai with cultural dress and school shoes with socks.

Saturday: House Banians, Track Pants with white shoes.

Class XI & XII:

Monday, Tuesday, Thursday Friday:

Boys and Girls: Dark blue pants and light blue shirt, black 'Naughty Boy' School shoes, socks, neck tie, belt and school blazer.



NOTE: 1

- i. No tight-fitting designs are accepted for school uniforms.
- ii. Pants and skirts should not be worn at low waist.
- iii. Extreme narrow bottom pants and extreme bell-bottom pants are not allowed.
- iv. Pleats on the skirts should be between 1 and 1.5 inches
- v. Shirt/T-shirt is always worn tucked-in.

NOTE: 2

Students coming to the school for whatever purpose must always be dressed in school uniform, unless they are exempted on any particular occasion. No student will be entertained in the school if they do not follow the required dress code.

HAIR STYLE:

- i. No fancy hair style is permitted in the school both for boys and girls.
- ii. Boys will have well-groomed hair. They will have their hair cut short without any trendy styles while the girls will have minimum shoulder level long hair, neatly tied with hair band/ribbon.
- iii. Short hair and 'boys cut' is strictly prohibited for girls. Shaved/bald cut,(brush-cut over the ears) and growing long/spiky/fancy hair is prohibited for boys.
- iv. Colouring and bleaching of hair is strictly prohibited both for boys and girls. Only black dye may be used if and when circumstances demand.
- v. Applying of hair gel of any kind (super hard, water gloss, wet look etc.) and excessive oiling of hair is not allowed.
- vi. Those who do not follow the permitted hair style, those students will be fined as well as other corrective measures will be taken.

MAKE UP:

- i. Using of make-up items Lipstick, eye liner, eye shadow, Mascara, Blusher, Nail Polish, Lip gloss with colour are strictly prohibited. Ornaments like, ring, necklace, ear-ring, toe-ring, wrist band are strictly prohibited.
- ii. Wrist bands, chains, rings, bangles, ear rings, nose-studs, payals, bracelets, chain rouges and all types of other ornaments are not allowed to be worn to the school.
- iii. Bringing and applying of cosmetics and make-ups of any kind is strictly prohibited. This include face powder, perfumes, lipsticks, eyebrow liner, kajal, nail-polish, coloured lip-gloss etc.

PROHIBITIONS:

- a. Imprinting of tattoos, body piercing and making artificial moles on any parts of the body is strictly prohibited.
- b. Consumption, bringing and possession of all types of tobacco products such as Tiranga, Cigarettes, Zarda, Raja, Khaini, Baba, Supari, Betel-nutand all type of intoxicants, drugs, alcoholic drinksetc. are strictly prohibited at school.
- c. Chewing gum is prohibited in the school.
- d. Driving in school uniform is not encouraged under any circumstances. Students without driving license are not permitted to drive/ride and vehicles/two wheelers.

SPECIAL NOTE:

If a student is expelled due to violation of any of the rules and regulations, it would be mentioned in the Transfer Certificate as 'Violation of School Rules and Regulations', or as 'misbehaviour and indiscipline'.

EXTRA-CURRICULAR ACTIVITIES & OTHER FACILITIES

School House System:

In order to create healthy competitive spirit and to encourage all-round development and holistic growth, the students are grouped into four different Houses. House Captains and Vice Captains stream line the activities of the house on the advice of the teachers-in-charge. Various inter-house competitions are held on a regular basis.



Library

Students are encouraged to make use of the library during the lunch break and other free periods. They can borrow books and return them as per the rules of the library. A fine of one rupee per day will be charged for every delay in returning the books to the library. Lost or damaged books need to be replaced or a compensation which is not less than the cost of the book needs to be paid to the library.



NCC:

Students are encouraged to get enrolled in National Cadet Corps. The cadets undergo training and to attend various camps and take part in social activities.



Various Clubs:

Students of classes VII and VIII are divided into various clubs like, Peace Club, Music Club, YSM/YCS, Maths Club, Science Club, Eco Club, Child Rights clubs, Art club, Health & Wellness club, Various Language clubs, NCC, etc. The club activities are aimed at building up the confidence and grooming the talents of students in their oratory skills, interpersonal and communication skills.

Computer Education:

Realizing the importance of information technology, computer education is provided to all classes in the school. Computer Education is provided to Students of Classes I to X. Reasonable fees are collected for twelve months. Class XI and XII Science stream also has IT as one of the subjects.



Science Laboratories:

We have well equipped laboratories for science and Maths. Students make good use of the lab and equip themselves for their future endeavours.



Digital Class Rooms:

To make classroom teaching-learning more effective interactive computer assisted visual presentation method is adopted in the school. A reasonable fee is charged from every student for twelve months.



Hostel Facility:

In order to cater to the needs of the children from far-flung villages and towns, the Management has provided Hostel facilities for Boys and Girls from classes III to XII - Montfort Home for the Boys and St. Mary's Home for the Girls. A student has to stay in the same hostel till the completion of an academic Year.



Stay in the rental houses:

Students are not encouraged to stay in rented houses. However, if anyone wanting to stay they are permitted to stay with their parents only. They need to get the consent of the village Chokdari/Leader in the prescribed format.

Home and School Links:

Close links between home and school can be of great benefit to all concerned. Parents are encouraged to visit the school with or without an appointment although a telephone call is helpful to ensure that the Class Teacher/Principal is available when you visit.



Parents are invited to meetings in the school from time to time. These are occasions to interact with the school and the teachers to get an update about your child's behaviour in the school and his/her progress in academics as well as in other co-curricular activities.

- iii. Develop a healthy lifestyle, paying attention to physical and mental well-being.

- vi. Be courteous and respectful to all, especially to the elders, teachers and parents. Greet all staff.
- vii. Develop an attitude of respect for people and the diversity in a context of social, moral, multi-cultural and spiritual awareness.
- viii. Cultivate good values, and be friendly with all, ensuring healthy relationship with the teachers and fellow students.
- ix. Develop the ability to work as part of a team, developing a sensitivity to other people's needs and points of view.
- x. Care for and respect nature; be aware of environmental issues and be responsible.
- xi. Participate actively in all school activities.

- xii. Speak always in English in the campus as it is the official language of the school.
- xiii. Be proud of your school and contribute to the good name of the school.
- xiv. Develop a creative and enquiring mind committed to life-long learning.
- xv. Seek excellence and be at your best in all that you do.

To the Parents:

1. Parents are expected to insist that their children attend the school daily and punctually, with neat and proper uniform.
2. They must encourage and motivate their children to be regular with their homework and provide sufficient time for study at home with a schedule that gives them minimum four hours for study.
3. Parents must go through the School Diary of their children to acquaint themselves with the rules and regulations of the school and insist that their children follow them strictly.
4. Parents are always welcome to meet the school authorities and express their views and suggestions in a spirit of cooperation and good will. Parents should inform the school authorities if their child faces any difficulty in the school.
5. At the end of the terminal examinations, the parents are invited to collect their son's/daughter's Progress Report from the school and discuss with the teachers about the progress and other aspects of their child's life in the school.
6. Parents shall in all possible ways cooperate with the school authorities for the greater good of their children.
